DEC FISH PEN PROJECT:

I have contacted the DEC for more information regarding the fish pens that they would like to put in at the BYC waters for the month of April. Dave

The response follows:

Thanks for the phone call last Wednesday. As I promised, attached are photos and a description of the pen rearing process.

Steelhead trout and Chinook salmon are two Lake Ontario sport fish species that are raised in pens during their early life to imprint on the water of Sandy Creek. Both species return to the stream they were born in as spawning adults. DEC studies have shown that pen rearing improves survival and returns by 2:1 over fish stocked directly into Lake Ontario without being pen reared.

The Sandy Creek Salmonid Pen Rearing Project (Project) is a group of volunteers that raise Steelhead and Chinooks in pens. The volunteers consist of fishing boat captains, recreational anglers, boy scouts, and SUNY Brockport students. Sandy Creek Marina had been the host location for the Project since 2003. Just prior to the 2016 pen rearing season, the marina owner resigned from the Project BOD and from hosting the Project. The Project coordinator is now looking for a new site to host the Project and asked me to inquire about Brockport Yacht Club possibly hosting the Project. BYC would be an ideal site because it is close to the lake and stays cooler longer than the former marina site.

The pens are net-covered metal tubular frames 20'X5'X5'. See attached pictures. There are 5 pens, three for Chinooks, two for steelhead. They will be assembled off site and towed to BYC. Ideally a DEC stocking truck would need to get close to the pens to hose fish into the pens on BYC land. Alternatively, they could be stocked into the pens at the DEC boat launch and towed to BYC. The fish are fed using automated feeders. Volunteers would need to fill the feeders every few days for three weeks from generally around the second week in April to the first week in May. Land access thru the Club would be most ideal, but access via water could also work. An area near the pens for a small dock-style storage bin to store the food would also be ideal. After fish are released,

the pens would be towed away from BYC and disassembled. The pen project will commit to releasing the fish prior to BY-C's boat launching date.

The Sandy Creek Salmonid Pen Rearing Project Coordinator and I would be happy to meet with the BYC Commodore, Officers, and BOD to discuss.

Thanks Dave, for considering this request and for passing it on to the BYC Officers, and members.
