We anticipate this will bring the cost much more in line with the budget. At this point, we are looking at completing the work in the fall. There will be a significant amount of prep that needs to be done. It is very possible that we will cut the season short by a couple weeks in order to facilitate the prep work. We will address that as we firm up details over the coming months. In the meantime, let's keep our fingers crossed for a warm summer and fair winds.
