You've heard the claims: Engine Rebuild in a bottle. Transmission miracle fix. Stop that Knock powder. They do not work.

But, here's one that does. Sea Foam by Gumout. Added to your fuel, gasoline, mixed or Diesel, it will assist in keeping your carburetor jest, or injectors clean. An additional benefit is that it acts as a fuel stabilizer.

Volvo Ocean Race 2018:

As many of you know I was in Newport RI for the Volvo Ocean Race last month. The event did not disappoint... on the contrary I had the time of my life for a week. The weather was well. What's expected of that area for May cold, rainy and foggy for most days but people pushed through it and made the most of it. After exploring Rhode Island and Massachusetts for a couple days and checking out Buzzards bay(by the way its named after me) I checked into my hotel on the beach in Newport a short bike ride from all the action on the harbor and the race action in Narragansett bay. They had practice racing that Thursday, An in-port race Saturday and the leg start Sunday in which they did a few laps of the harbor than raced across

the Atlantic to Cardiff Wales. I was lucky enough on Sunday to crew on Weatherly the 12 meter 1962 Americas cup winner to follow the Volvo fleet out of the bay and into the huge swell and fog we encountered in the Atlantic before waving goodbye to the VOR sailors and turning back for a cold brew (or many brews) in Newport. I got drenched on that ride being on the bow working the grinders as we tacked back n forth trying to keep up with far superior racing boats. Team Brunel a Dutch team dominated the racing in Newport by far and many are routing for them even over the Americans 11th hour racing. This edition of the VOR has been intense as there are currently 3 boats tied for the lead with only one race leg left to go (Gothenburg to The Hague in Netherlands) Race around the world 45 thousand miles and 3 boats are tied for the lead is a first and is very exciting. The racing, the people I met, racing opportunities I now have in Newport, The partying, the food and just overall experience alone made this the best time of my life and I never wanted to leave. Newport is quickly becoming a second home for me and I wanted to share the amazing photos and videos I took there with my fellow BYC members.
