Any other ideas out there? Yours may be the best, so submit them!

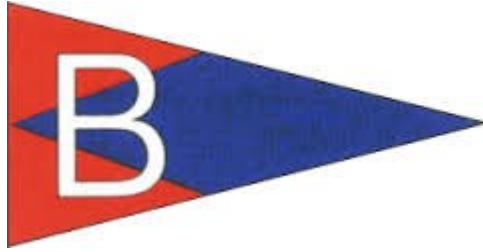
